Dear Friends,

Thanks to you, Oroville has enjoyed many community enhancements over the past year, from the beautiful flower pots lining our downtown corridor to trailhead enhancements and pickleball courts. Oroville Streetscape and The Oroville Initiative volunteers have continued their work in making Oroville a better place to live, work, and visit. We are extremely grateful for your past financial support.

This past year, your donations allowed us to:

1. Plant 3 new sidewalk trees
2. Provide hanging flower baskets for downtown
3. Plant flower pots in front of downtown businesses and flowers in parks and planters around town
4. Provide flowered flags in Centennial Park
5. Relandscape flower beds in Centennial Park
6. Replace the decking in the gazebo at Centennial Park
7. Replace the mural at Centennial Park with metal silhouettes that capture Oroville's past
8. Create two pickleball courts with net systems in Veterans Park
9. Install concrete picnic tables and landscaping at our trailheads

In addition to these projects, we launched a tourism website for Oroville with www.discoverorovillewa.com, placed advertisements for Oroville in several online and print publications around the state, and hosted 300 bicyclists who came through Oroville as a result of our advertising. Finally, we celebrated the 2nd year of delivering "The Oroville Coffee News", our community newsletter, designed to keep the community informed on TOI and Streetscape projects, Chamber of Commerce initiatives, and happenings at our schools, around town, and with other organizations.

We are saddened by the passing of Jeff Bunnell, a vital member of our team, but were heartened by the fact that Jeff's contribution to our community was acknowledged by many. In late December, the City of Oroville honored Jeff by renaming Triangle Park to Jeff Bunnell Park. In early January, the Oroville Chamber of Commerce also honored Jeff, naming him "Citizen of the Year".
